



GUIDELINES FOR MOR REGISTRATION

Any person / entity involved in an activity listed under Regulation 6 of Subsidiary Legislation 433.06, reproduced hereunder must be registered with the Plant Protection Directorate (PPD):

- propagate, grow and trade or any activity associated with any plant and plant products or other objects listed in Schedule V part A and seeds which are referred in Schedule IV part A of the L.N. 97/2004.
- be an importer that import any plant, plant product or other object listed in Schedule V part A, and seeds which are listed in Schedule IV part A of the L.N. 97/2004.
- be any collective warehouse or dispatching centres of potatoes include tuber and seeds and fruits of Citrus include all hybrids.
- Treats wood with heat treatment as per ISPM15.
- Product and market plant reproductive material

The Director may, in cases where there is no risk of any spreading of harmful organisms, exempt any person who is involved in local trading of plant and plant products from local suppliers or for personal use (not for professional consumers).

Approval Process

- I. On submission of the online application, an inspector will schedule an appointment for an on-the-spot inspection.
- II. During the inspection, the inspectors will verify the following;
 - a. A system of records is available;
 - b. Place for the segregation of consignments;
 - c. An area suitable for inspection is present on site, with adequate lighting and having an inspection table and disinfection equipment;
 - d. The following information is to be provided during the inspection:
 - A list of products concerned;
 - e. If applicant intends to apply for checks to be carried out at a place other than a point of entry into Malta or a place closed by, the applicant must provide the following documents:
 - A georeferenced site plan of the premises;
 - A detailed plan indicating a place where a consignment can be segregation from other goods in case of suspected/infestation by harmful organisms.
- III. Following the inspection and verification of the documentation provided, the applicant is informed about the outcome of the verification process.
- IV. If the application is approved a compliance certificate valid for a year will be issued and sent to the applicant by post.
- V. The activity is registered in the Malta Official Register and an MOR number is given.
